College, Raleigh; served from 1901-13 as Commander of Col. Waiter Walter Moore Camp of United Confederate Veterans; and was presi- dent of State Fair 1908-09, when President Theodore Roosevelt was was speaker and guest. Horne Memorial Methodist Church, Johns- ton County's most beaufiful sacred edifice, was named in memory of Ashley Horne whose portrait, painted by Mrs. Marshall Wil- liams of Faison, hangs in the Hall of History, Raleigh. The bronze monument, sculptured by Augustus Lukeman, costing \$10,000.00 now standing in capital square Raleigh. was the gift of Ashley Horne to his native State as a memorial to the Women of the Confederacy.
