Dodd, Emma	Dec. 8, 1856	Oct. 5, 1879	My beloved wife. (That is, Dr Gaston H. Dodd's (Age 22 years, 9 mos. 27 days.
Dodd, Evelyn Creech	March 17, 1849	Feb. 11, 1909	Wife of John D. Dodd. (Stone reads "Evelyn Creech, wife of John D. Dodd. Evelyn Creech Dodd was grand-daughter of Benajah & E. Tarver Horne- Daughter Stanford and Martha Horne Creech- Mother of Dr. William E. Dodd, Chicago University.

Dodd, Mary	Sept. 27, 1881	May 18, 1882	Daughter of J. D. & Emline Dodd. (Infant sisters on same stone.) (Dodd) Infant daughter of J. D. & Emline Dodd. Born and died Jan. 22, 1888.
Horne, Ashley	March 27, 1841	Oct. 22, 1913	(Son of Benajah and Elizabeth Tarver Horne. Ashley Horne enlisted in Co. C. 15th N. C. Regiment, later serving in the 53rd N. C. Regiment. Grimes Brigade, fighting with Lee in Northern Virginia, where he was present at Appomattox. Ashley Horne was member of State Senate 1884-85; member of financial committee which established A.&M. College, Raleigh; served from 1901-13 as Commander of Col. Katie Walter Moore Camp of United Confederate Veterans; and was president of State Fair 1908-09, when President Theodore Roosevelt was speaker and guest. Horne Memorial Methodist Church, Johnston County's most beautiful sacred edifice, was named in memory of Ashley Horne whose portrait, painted by Mrs. Marshall Williams of Faison, hangs in the Hall of History, Raleigh. The bronze monument, sculptured by Augustus Lukeman, costing \$10,000.00 now standing in capital square Raleigh. was the gift of Ashley Horne to his native State as a memorial to the Women of the Confederacy.
