	<p>grandmother (a sister of Mrs. Crissie Avera Ellington, wife of Rev. John F. Ellington, second pastor of Liberty Church) was the great-grand-daughter of Thomas Avera, Revolutionary soldier, who was descended from Alexander Avera who married Elizabeth Holbrook, grand-daughter of Farmaness Holbrook, of Bath, Pamlico Precinct, 1711. Thomas Avera of Revolutionary fame was also the great-grand-father of the late Mrs. Moses Winston of Selma. The paternal Jones line of Mary Ann Jones McCullers is said to derive from the English nobility, through Mary Hubert Claiborne wife of Col. Augustus Claiborne and daughter of Bulmer Herbert, son of Lord John Herbert. Lady Mary Herbert was maid of honor to Queen Ann. Melba McCullers, grand-daughter of Mary Ann McCullers, personally <del>investigated</del> investigated the Jones documents in Somerset House., London, in 1922 but does not vouch for the authenticity of above. She does, however, vouch for the Avera line of descent.)</p>

McCullers, W. H. Sr.	Dec. 16, 1812	May 7, 1890	(Son of John and Elizabeth McCullers, William Henry was the grandson of "Minute-man" John McCullers, later Captain of Johnston County Militia during the Revolutionary War. Liberty Church was built on land belonging to W. H. McCullers, who is said to have been one of the first or second clerks of Liberty Church. Capt. John McCullers, of Revolutionary fame married Mary, daughter of Francis Jones, 3rd., and was willed by him a parcel of land in Johnston County. McCullers is variously spelled in the old documents: Cullers, McCullems, McCullers, McCullers, McCullers, etc.)
